Thank you again for your email, in which you formally request information in regards to distance learning oversight. When dealing with requests for information made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the 'Act'), Estyn's obligations include:-

- Confirming or denying whether it holds information of the description specified in the request; and
- 2. Communicating the information requested to the applicant.

There are a number of exemptions under the Act that impact these obligations. Estyn is required to consider whether an exemption applies in the context of the information being released into the public domain, not just in the context of the information being released to the particular applicant that has requested the information.

If Estyn releases information in response to a Freedom of Information request, this is essentially a decision that the information can be released in response to any similar request from any member of the public.

In response to your request, I can confirm that in March 2020, we suspended school inspections and related activity. Since then we have been supporting the Welsh Government with their continuity of learning programme and been in touch with schools across Wales to gather information about their work. While distance learning has been a focus of these discussions, the purpose of the calls has been to identify interesting practice and ongoing challenges faced by schools in relation to promoting learning and supporting vulnerable learners. We have contacted over 320 providers across Wales during the past fortnight and information from these calls will form part of the evidence base for a thematic review that we will publish in early spring 2021. Today we have also launched a series of surveys which will contribute to this work. They are available here.
